Use the Research Idea Generator to explore, refine, and prioritise research ideas.

1. Study Title

- Create a clear, concise title that summarises your research focus.
 - What is the main topic or problem your research addresses?
 - Is the title specific enough to reflect your study scope?

2. Byline

- List the main researchers involved.
 - O Who is the primary investigator?
 - Who are the supervisors and co-investigators?

3. Background

- Explain the context and importance of your study.
 - What is already known about this topic?
 - What gap or problem does your research aim to address?
 - Why is this research important in your field or setting?

4. Research Question

- Formulate a clear, focused question that your study will answer.
 - What exactly do you want to find out?
 - Who is your study population?
 What intervention/exposure and comparison will you use?
 - o What outcome(s) will you measure?

Use the **Research Question Validator Tool** to evaluate your question's clarity, feasibility, relevance, and impact. Get immediate feedback using PICOT and FINERMAPS frameworks to ensure your question is well-formed and meaningful.

5. Study Aims

- Define what your study intends to achieve.
 - What is your primary aim (main objective)?
 - What are your secondary aims or specific objectives?

6. References

- List the key sources that support your study rationale and framework.
 - What prior research or guidelines inform your study?
 - Have you included foundational and recent literature?
